- 6 out of 10 have a diagnosed mental illness

446 youth received help at Daybreak.

**105** youth engaged in Daybreak's street outreach services.

73 moved off the streets into a safe place.

**293** youth were kept safe in our emergency shelter and provided with food, counseling, and more.

272 reunited with family or moved into another suitable home.

#### 93 youth resided in our transitional apartments and participated in programs that help prepare them to be independent, self-supporting adults.

45 exited the program to other stable housing upon leaving Daybreak.

**151** youth received employment support and training to help them find a job and succeed in the workplace.

233 youth continued or enhanced their education while staying at Daybreak.

**119** youth were employed when they left Daybreak.
